CHARGES:

Allegedly, the Mr. Bennett's large, grey, Pitbull broke free from their owner and attacked Ms. Nwangu's miniature poodle around the head, neck, and legs. This is a violation of Section 3-131 'Manner of Keeping Animals; Prohibition of Nuisances', Section 3-132 'Public Nuisance Conditions'; Section 3-135 'Animals at large prohibited'; Section 3-136 'Dangerous Animal', Section 3-142 'Irresponsible Pet Owner'; Section 3-145 'Ferret, dog, and cat license'; Section 3-182 'Potentially Dangerous Animals'; Section 3-186 'Vaccination of dogs, cates, and ferrets'.

CHARGES:

The City of College Park Animal Control is requesting a Dangerous Dog Hearing due to the dog listed above allegedly biting, chasing and attacking a hound type dog off leash and off property on December 30th 2023. This is in violation of Section 3-131, "Manner of Keeping Animals"; Section 3-142 "Irresponsible Pet Owner"; Section 3-136 "Dangerous Animals"; and Section 3-182 "Potentially Dangerous Animal"; and Section 3-145 "Ferret, dog, and cat licenses."

GENERAL RULES

Cases shall be called in the order in which they appear on the docket. The Commission may consider cases out of the order presented on the written docket, at the discretion of the Chairperson, to promote efficiency and as an accommodation to the parties involved.

All attempts will be made to allot time fairly to opposing parties and witnesses. However, all persons testifying under oath shall speak only after receiving recognition and consent of the Chairperson.

Hearings are open to the public. Verbal and physical disruptions from the public are prohibited. Members of the public are required to comply with rules, directives, and orders of the Commission.
